
Prevent a Southern California Mobility Crisis by Acting Now

Metrolink's existing funding covers operations and maintenance costs, but does not cover all State of Good Repair needs and growth or capacity-adding projects. Significant funding for growth is needed to meet regional and national needs for transportation, free-flowing trade routes and environmental sustainability.








Affordable housing is moving inland from the coastal region, Central Los Angeles and Orange counties to Northern Los Angeles, Eastern Riverside and San Bernardino Counties.

By 2035 there will be 4 Million People Added to the Region, Increasing the Population to **22 Million – Half of the State's Population.**

Metrolink's Rail System:

538 route miles shared with freight and Amtrak

Approximately 61% of Metrolink-owned right-of-way is single track, creating bottlenecks and delays for commuters and freight trains

Currently limited to mostly **one-directional** peak service

Parallel to some of the **most crowded freeways**

Connects job centers with affordable housing throughout Southern California

No dedicated funding for system expansion and growth

The Region is Projected to Add 1.7 Million Jobs by 2035.


Major job centers remain coastally located.
