Central Maintenance Facility (CMF) Action Plan January Update

We continue to make progress on our commitment to be a good neighbor to the communities near the Central Maintenance Facility (CMF). All but one of the short-term initiatives of the CMF Action Plan have been completed and all mid-term and long-term initiatives are on schedule for ontime completion.

We have completed the installation and assessment of sound monitors in the yard and we have fully optimized our use of ground power. Additionally, we added new accountability metrics to our maintenance contract as part of the new bundled contract.

Lastly, the Internal Audit team presented the audit findings to Metrolink's Audit and Finance committee, then to our Board of Directors. Results of the audit were presented to the public at the CMF community meeting on February 22.

Community Meeting Recap

On February 22, 2020, Metrolink held a community meeting for the residents of Elysian Valley, Cypress Park and Glassell Park. Representatives from the offices of Congressional Member Adam Schiff (28th District), Supervisor Hilda Solis (SD-1) and Los Angeles City Council Members Paul Krekorian (CD-2) and Mitch O'Farrell(CD-13) were also in attendance. Metrolink Director Paul Phillips also attended and addressed the audience.

During the meeting, Metrolink provided the community with updates regarding its CMF Community Action Plan. Highlights included a comprehensive summary of internal audit findings and Metrolink's response to the audit findings, including ground power station usage and future plans to modernize the maintenance facility as we work towards a zero emissions future. We also took this opportunity to answer questions from the community.

We appreciate the community's feedback and thank you for your attendance, it is important to hear from you. The next community meeting will be May 2020, more details to come.



Tier 4 Update

As of today, February 29, 2020, 35 of the 40 Tier 4 locomotives procured by Metrolink have been delivered to SCRRA property. Upon delivery from the manufacturer, each locomotive must undergo extensive testing prior to its acceptance into service.

- 32 locomotives are in service
- 3 are being prepared for service
- All 40 Tier 4 locomotives are scheduled to be in service by Summer 2020.
- 24 out of 29 Legacy Tier 0 locomotives have been decommissioned

Tier 4 locomotives reduce emissions between 65% and 85% compared to Metrolink's legacy Tier 2 and Tier 0 locomotives, respectively.
