5th Lead Cut-over

Reminder: On November 3, just after 6:30 p.m., the Centralized Track Control (CTC) signaling system in the Los Angeles Union Station area will be shut down for two weeks to upgrade the switching system and complete installation of a new lead track into the station. This means that all of the track switching normally done by remote control from our Operations Center will have to be done by hand. Metrolink switchmen will be out by the tracks hand-throwing the switches that route your train to the correct track.

Metrolink is planning to complete and test these upgrades in time to reactivate CTC on November 17, 2006. During the 14-day upgrade period,

please be aware that all trains entering and leaving Union Station should expect delays of up to 15 minutes. (Occasionally, in the face of unforeseen circumstances, delays may be even longer.)

We apologize for these delays and any inconvenience you may encounter as a result of the construction. Once completed, the new track improvements will help increase safety and decrease delays at Union Station.

Thanksgiving Holiday Service

The holiday season is upon us, and Thanksgiving dinner with family and friends is only a train ride away. Metrolink is offering special savings on our Thanksgiving Day train services.

Beginning November 1, riders can purchase advance one-way and round-trip tickets for Thanksgiving Day service on the San Bernardino and Inland Empire-Orange County lines. Thanksgiving Day service will be operated only on the San Bernardino and Inland Empire-Orange County lines. Buy your tickets at any Metrolink Ticket Vending Machine (TVM) by pressing the ticket button that says, "Thanksgiving Special Tkt."

Your round-trip ticket for November 23—Thanksgiving Day—is good for your return trip any day through Sunday, November 26, on the San Bernardino and Inland Empire-Orange County lines. Regular weekday service will resume on ALL lines on Friday, November 24. Regular weekday fares will apply for tickets purchased on Friday and regular weekend fares will apply for tickets purchased on Saturday and Sunday of Thanksgiving weekend.

San Bernardino Line

Receive 25 percent off regular weekday fares for one-way and round-trip tickets purchased for Thanksgiving Day (November 23).

Inland Empire-Orange County Line

Receive 50 percent off regular weekday fares for one-way and round-trip tickets purchased for Thanksgiving Day (November 23).

Metrolink/Amtrak—Shared-Service Trains

Metrolink ticket holders do *not* need reservations to ride the Ventura County Line shared-service trains operated by Metrolink (numbers 153 and 158) and Amtrak (numbers 799 and 768) from November 20 through November 24 (except Thanksgiving Day).

Special Kids Promotion—All Lines

Up to three children ages 17 and under may ride free with each paying adult, Thursday, November 23, through Sunday, November 26, 2006. *Children that ride free on Metrolink may be charged for connections on non-Metrolink service.*

Rail 2 Rail

Monthly passes will not be accepted on Amtrak Pacific Surfliner trains on blackout dates: Wednesday, November 22; Thursday, November 23; and Sunday, November 26. All passengers must have reservations and tickets purchased in advance to ride Amtrak trains from **November 21 through 27** (except for Metrolink/Amtrak shared-service trains).

As a Metrolink passenger, the last thing you want is to be involved in a grade-crossing accident. Even if no one is hurt, such an incident will likely entail a significant delay. Metrolink, committed to protecting lives and preventing delays, has embarked upon a comprehensive safety-enhancement program on our Antelope Valley and Ventura County lines. The ambitious sealed-corridor program will improve the safety of travel over 65 miles of railroad by sealing 63 grade crossings to prevent motorists and pedestrians from reaching the tracks.

SCRRA, in a strong partnership with the California Public Utilities
Commission and local jurisdictions, is collaborating with technical experts
and elected officials to improve grade-crossing safety in an expansive project
corridor that stretches from downtown Los Angeles to San Fernando on
the Antelope Valley Line and to Moorpark on the Ventura County Line. We
plan to work with a broad coalition of stakeholders and to employ a mix of

Safety Matters



Did you know that Metrolink provides a brochure called *Emergency Evacuation Instructions* that is available in the racks near the doors of every passenger car?

Here's a summary of instructions you should follow in the event of an onboard emergency:

- Listen for your conductor's instructions.
- Please assist fellow passengers in need of help.
- Leave bicycles, wheelchairs, and other bulky items behind.
- Evacuate to an adjacent passenger car.
- If an adjacent car is not accessible (or you are instructed to do so), then;



conventional strategies and new technologies. In some cases, we may increase the length of medians to prevent people from driving onto the right-of-way; in others, we'll enhance signal systems or install additional gates. Many of the crossings will likely be widened to eliminate traffic backups over tracks, and we will consider future land uses along the railroad corridors to avoid potential grade-crossing and right-of-way problems.

We are currently bringing together key stakeholders who represent four sub-corridors within the project area. For the next several months, these stakeholders will work together to determine effective strategies for the sealed-corridor project in their respective areas. Metrolink expects to see strong plans for the project being developed within the next six months; construction on some parts of the project may begin within 18 months. SCRRA's Antelope Valley/Ventura County program is one of the most ambitious urban sealed-corridor projects ever attempted.

You can exit via the regular train doors by following these steps:

- Break the plastic safety covering over the door release ring;
- Pull red ring down;
- **■** Grip rubber between doors;
- Pull door open; and
- Exit with caution.

You can exit through the emergency windows by following these steps:

- Pull red handles toward you or pull ring to remove strip;
- Pull window toward you using both hands (windows are heavy, so remove with caution);
- Place window inside train; and
- Exit with caution.






