What is SCORE?

The Southern California Optimized Rail Expansion program (SCORE) is a \$10 billion capital improvement program representing Metrolink's ambitious plan to upgrade its system before the Los Angeles 2028 Summer Olympic and Paralympic Games. The plan includes grade crossing, station and signal improvements, and track additions, as well as work to accelerate progress towards Metrolink's zero-emissions future. What is the SCORE Simi Valley Double Track Project?

Metrolink is proposing the Simi Valley Double Track Project at the Simi Valley Station on Metrolink's Ventura County Line (VCL) which will enable more frequent service, with train service expected every 30 minutes in each direction; and improve service reliability and on-time performance, as trains will no longer have to wait for one another to pass. Additionally, the new platform access with an underpass crossing will create a convenient and safe walkway for pedestrians. Improved at-grade crossings will facilitate Quiet Zone ready corridors that will minimize train horn blowing.

Project improvements will take place in two Segments. The chart below describes what the Project entails:



Project Schedule

The environmental process is expected to complete in summer 2021 and design reviews expected to be complete in summer of 2023. Regulatory permitting is expected to begin in the spring of 2021. Construction for segment 1 improvements is scheduled to begin in the fall of 2023, with completion expected in the spring of 2025. Public involvement on this project continues now through the spring of 2025.



Simi Valley Double Track Scoping Meeting

On November 18, 2020, a public Scoping Meeting was held for the proposed Simi Valley Double Track Project. As part of Metrolink's environmental review process, this public Scoping Meeting was an initial effort to garner comments on the scope of the Environmental Impact Report (EIR) being prepared for the project. Representatives from Metrolink explained the purpose of the meeting, provided an overview of the Metrolink system and Ventura County Line; presented an overview of the Simi Valley Double Track Project components, benefits, map and timeline; and provided an overview of the environmental process. The Scoping Meeting concluded with a Question and Answer to allow attendees to provide feedback, comments, and questions.
